The indigenous population and French speakers have the highest self-employment rates in Golden.





NEWCOMERS

Immigrants who obtained landed immigrant or permanent resident status between 2016 and 2021.

PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

Persons who experienced activity limitations imposed by a condition(s) or by long-term physical and/or mental health problem that has lasted or is expected to last 6 months or more.

FRENCH SPEAKERS

With respect to official languages, persons who can conduct a conversation in French only or in French and English.
